DURING THESE YEARS OVER ONE MILLION IRISH CATHOLICS DIED OF STARVATION AND RELATED DISEASES.

There is another official report which gives information about the amount of agricultural produce in Ireland during the year 1847. This year was the most devastating for the people during the Hunger period. The report was prepared by Thomas Larcom of the Board of Works and ordered by Lord Clarendon, Lord Lieutenant, who was in charge of Ireland. Larcom was recognized for the good work he had done in organizing and accumulating accurate information.

There was also a record of hay and flax produced. The report showed that 5,338,575 acres were used for produce valued at 44,958,120 Pounds. Total acres in Ireland is 20,262,641. Only a little more than one-fourth was used for producing much needed food.

There are other records of exports on a quarterly basis for 1846. At the same time the law excluded foreign food from being brought into Ireland because of import duties, Irish grown food was being exported to England when people were starving.

There are reports of 16 ships arriving at the Thames River on one day with food exports from Ireland. These ships came from all over Ireland. The exporting of food and other materials never stopped over this entire Hunger period.

There were letters sent to the English government to stop exporting grain used for making spirits. These requests were refused by Lord Russell and other officials.
