Dear Archbishop Becciu,

We are sending more material in support of the "Irish Hunger Martyrs, 1845-51". Enclosed are 625 additional signatures in support of beatification for the Irish Hunger Martyrs. This brings the total number of signed supporting documentation for the cause to over 28,000, when you include what has already been sent to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints.

There you will find extensive research and information that details the sacrifice and suffering of these martyrs who died as a result of not renouncing their Catholic faith. The Catholic Church did not record the names of the victims because so many were dying. We have sent names from official inquest records. There are also names from parishes recorded in Census of Deaths reports requested by Church authorities. These names are in previous information sent.

Over 1 million of the Faithful had to watch their families perish through a slow starvation process during this man-made famine. Much food was exported while they and their children were starving. They were offered food if they changed their Faith. Parents had to watch their children die slowly on a daily basis and deal with their own suffering. Their physical pain and mental anguish deserves recognition.

The Irish people have been persecuted for their Catholic Faith for centuries. The Penal Laws were one of the most anti-religious acts ever recorded. Their sons and daughters have spread the Faith all over the world as missionaries and immigrants. This beatification would honor the Irish people and renew their Faith today.
